She is ordained by Dr. John Looper, Restoration Fellowship International, Cleveland, Tennessee. Udumalpet is a city of 300,000 people located near the city of Coimbatore. This congregation was founded by pastor Sam Bakther John who has founded a second congregation in the city of Coimbatore. Vijay became senior pastor for this Udumalpet congregation. Under her leadership, the congregation has grown to nearly 500 members in the past three years. This congregation is the "sister" congregation to the Granite Quarry Fellowship, Granite Quarry, North Carolina, pastored by Dr. David Caron. Pictured at the bottom of this page are two photographs of their new church building (inside and outside). This new building will be completed and dedicated on September 20, 2015. One thousand two hundred people are expected to attend. The dedication address will be given by Rev. Emmanul Paul, senior pastor, 3,000 member Zion Pentecostal Church, Vellore, Tamil Nadu.
