HEBREW Seminar (16th-19th) & Pastors' Conference (22nd-25th) September 12-27, 2008

We make it very clear that there is no other God than Jehovah and He has manifested Himself as Jesus, our Messiah. We encourage our pastors to have their converts get rid of these false gods. "Ye shall make you no idols nor graven image, neither rear you up a standing image, neither shall ye set up *any* image of stone in your land, to bow down unto it: for I *am* the LORD your God." (Leviticus 26:1) Imagine, there are enough false gods in India for every American to have his/her own!

Purchase land behind CSI Chapel	5,000.00	
Purchase land behind Library/Arnold Apartment/Dormitory	15,000.00

These additions to our campus would increase the beds to 148 in dorms, and 16 in more private accommodations.
